Describe the project when you started it.

Internally there was a mix of terracotta tiles, timber parquet and carpet, teamed with pinch pleat and tab curtains, laminate and tile kitchen and bathroom, oversized timber furniture, poor ventilation and lighting.



What, in your view, is the pivotal piece in this scheme, and why?

In the kitchen/dining area, the pivotal piece is the 'Dome' light fitting from Yellow Goat Design. In the adjacent outdoor area, it is the combination of stack stone and wooden louvres in the rendered wall - the combination of materials delivers privacy, ventilation and interest.

What was your clients' brief - what did they want you to achieve for them?

They wanted a contemporary home to accommodate their growing family, a place to entertain family and friends, and they wanted me to work with existing furniture of sentimental value. They also needed to have the floor plan of the home redefined, and wanted to include GreenSmart solutions.
